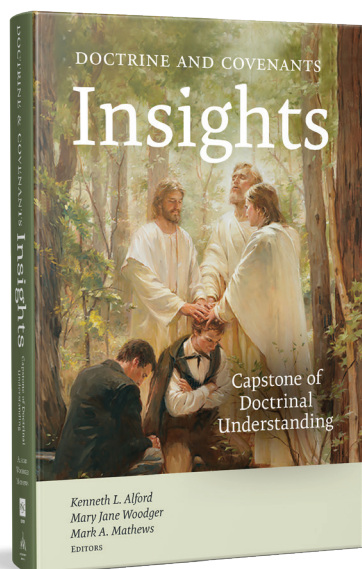

The purpose of this new volume is to help readers take a fresh look at the principles, teachings, stories, and people found in the Doctrine and Covenants. The Doctrine and Covenants is filled with a wide variety of content—including revelations dictated to the Prophet Joseph Smith Jr. by the Lord (like section 1), the words of an angel (section 2), visions (sections 76, 110, 137, and 138, for example), minutes of a meeting (section 102), letters (such as sections 121–23, 127–28), ancient manuscripts (section 7 and portions of section 93), a temple dedicatory prayer (section 109), a policy statement (section 134), and

an account of Joseph and Hyrum's martyrdom (section 135).

President Ezra Taft Benson taught, "The Doctrine and Covenants is a glorious book of scripture given directly to our generation. It contains the will of the Lord for us in these last days that precede the Second Coming of Christ. It contains many truths and doctrines not fully revealed in other scripture.
