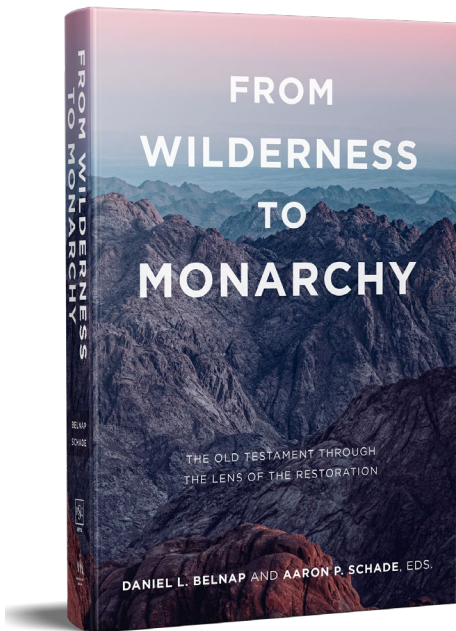

# FROM WILDERNESS TO MONARCHY

The Old Testament Through the Lens of the Restoration



## ABOUT THE EDITORS

DANIEL L. BELNAP is a professor of ancient scripture at Brigham Young University and teaches courses on religion and ancient Near Eastern studies and texts. He received a BA in international relations from Brigham Young University, an MA in ancient Near Eastern studies from BYU, and an MA and PhD in Northwest Semitics from the University of Chicago.

AARON P. SCHADE is a professor of ancient scripture at Brigham Young University and teaches courses on religion and ancient Near Eastern languages, history, and archaeology. Schade is the codirector of the Khirbat Ataruz Excavation in Ataruz, Jordan. He completed his graduate studies at the University of Toronto in Near and Middle Eastern civilizations and is a faculty member at the BYU Jerusalem Center for Near Eastern Studies.

PROVO, UTAH—*From Wilderness to Monarchy* continues the story begun in *From Creation to Sinai*, tracing Israel's path from their entrance into the promised land to the establishment of the Davidic monarchy.

It offers a Latter-day Saint perspective on Israel's spiritual and historical journey as recounted in the Old Testament. Central to this period are the emergence of prophetic leadership and the development of kingship, both of which reshape Israel's identity and covenantal journey. Written from a Latter-day Saint perspective yet accessible to a broader audience, this volume combines sweeping narrative with detailed scriptural analysis. It emphasizes that the Old Testament, though ancient, remains spiritually relevant and instructive today.

Beginning with the book of Joshua, *From Wilderness to Monarchy* explores Israel's transition from Moses's leadership to the hardships and difficulties in the conquest accounts—focusing on cov-

enantal duties, military battles, and moral challenges. The book moves through the era of the Judges, highlighting both general spiritual decline and the faithfulness of individuals like Ruth and Hannah. It then follows the reigns of Saul, David, and Solomon, examining their leadership, flaws, and divine interactions. The volume concludes with insights into the literary, theological, and temple-centered significance of Psalms, Proverbs, and the Song of Solomon.

As a companion to [From Creation to Sinai](#) (published in 2021), *From Wilderness to Monarchy* invites readers to see the Old Testament not merely as history but as a spiritual guide for modern covenant living.
