

# GOD'S WORD IN OUR HEARTS

## Learning from the Old Testament



### ABOUT THE AUTHOR

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PROVO AND SALT LAKE CITY, UTAH—A new collection of essays, *God's Word in Our Hearts: Learning from the Old Testament*, is designed to assist teachers and students of the Old Testament in deepening their understanding of this sacred scripture and fostering a closer relationship with God.

The editors of this new volume have compiled works from Latter-day Saint scholars to enhance comprehension, recognizing that Old Testament cultures and peoples may be unfamiliar to many readers. The essays, written from diverse perspectives, explore the Torah, the Writings, and the Prophets, aiming to nurture God's word in our hearts and enrich the lives of those we teach.

The first six essays follow the Torah, representing Genesis through Deuteronomy, exploring different aspects of covenants in the Old Testament and their significance. Each essay delves into how covenants shape the lives, responsibilities, and spiritual journeys of God's people.

The second section comes from the Writings. The Writings reflect "the variety of material collected, . . . ranging from historical works (e.g., Chronicles), prayers

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(Psalms), [and] wisdom works (e.g., Job)" (Marc Zvi Brettler, "Kethuvim," in *The Jewish Study Bible* [Oxford University Press, 1985], 1275). In this section, the authors explore how individuals in the Old Testament demonstrate faith and provide empowerment.

The third section examines the Prophets, which consist of the four major prophets (ordered based on length of their book)—Isaiah, Jeremiah, Ezekiel, and Daniel—and the twelve minor prophets (shorter books) from Hosea to Malachi. A unifying theme in these essays is God's interaction with his people, specifically his emphasis of justice, mercy, and the importance of covenants.
