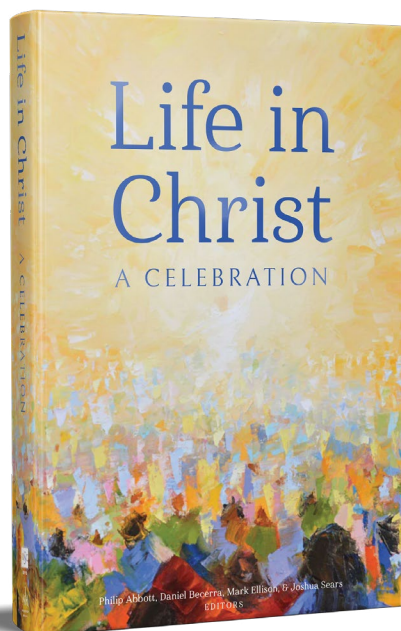

So did Peter when, watching others walk away, he declared that Jesus has "the words of

eternal life" (John 6:68). Jesus's offer of life was more than a quick fix or a tem-

porary distraction: "I am come that [you] might have life," he said, "and that [you] might have it more abundantly" (John 10:10).
