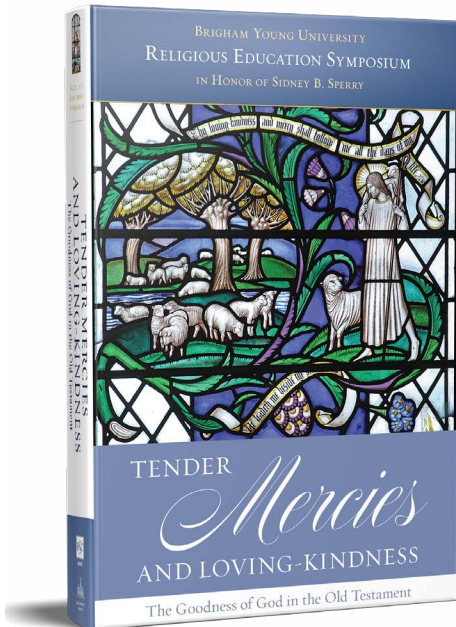

ABOUT THE EDITORS

DAVID ROLPH SEELY is a professor of ancient scripture at Brigham Young University. His areas of teaching, research, and publication include the Hebrew Bible, the New Testament, temple studies, the Dead Sea Scrolls, and the Book of Mormon.

His research focuses on the Dead Sea Scrolls, the Bible (particularly the Old Testament Minor Prophets), ancient and modern manuscript studies, and contextualizing the Book of Mormon in the ancient world.
