ELDER BRUCE C. HAFEN is an emeritus General Authority Seventy who grew up in St. George, Utah. After serving a mission to Germany, he received a bachelor’s degree (BYU) and a juris doctor degree (University of Utah). He practiced law in Salt Lake City, then taught at BYU’s J. Reuben Clark Law School. Elder Hafen also served as president of BYU–Idaho and dean of the BYU law school. Called as a full-time General Authority in 1996, he later served as president of the St. George Temple. He is the author of several books, his most recent one, *Faith Is Not Blind*, being coauthored with his wife Marie. The Hafens have seven children and forty-six grandchildren.

RICHARD LYMAN BUSHMAN was born in Salt Lake City in 1931 and brought up in Portland, Oregon. He received his undergraduate and graduate degrees from Harvard University and taught at Brigham Young University, Boston University, and the University of Delaware. He retired as Gouverneur Morris Professor of History at Columbia University in 2001 and was a visiting Howard W. Hunter Chair of Mormon Studies at Claremont Graduate University from 2008 to 2011. He is the author of a number of books, including *Joseph Smith: Rough Stone Rolling*. He served as co-general editor of *The Joseph Smith Papers* until 2012. He and his wife Claudia have six children and twenty grandchildren.
