

APPENDIX 2

DATA FOR UTAH/IDAHO TOWN OF ORIGIN ANALYSIS

Mormon settlers came to Arizona from all previously settled areas of Utah and Idaho (see map, 17). For our purposes, a family is defined as a married woman or any children traveling together or both. Polygamous wives are counted as one family, unless wives came in different years. Van Cott's *Utah Place Names* was used to understand some names. Unidentified areas (e.g., Sevier River) are included with the county seat (e.g., Richfield) and listed in parentheses. Women are listed by their name when coming into Arizona with later married names in parentheses.

Pioneer Commemoration: Daughters of Utah Pioneers. Although the first Daughters of Utah Pioneers camp was organized in Mesa in 1924 at the Rex Hotel, in later years, other camps were organized closer to where the women lived. In November 1941, the Henry Standage Camp was organized for women in the Alma District of Mesa, with Ethel Stewart Russell (daughter of Julia Christina Hobson Stewart, 698) as captain. Russell is shown here in 1956 dressed in pioneer costume as was encouraged for all meetings. Daughters of Utah Pioneers encouraged members to preserve pioneer diaries and journals, to write sketches of their ancestors, and to collect relics and artifacts.
