Yea, let God be true but every man a liar, as it is written, "That thou mightest be justified in thy sayings and mightest overcome when thou art judged." ^a ⁵But if we remain in our unrighteousness and commend the righteousness of God, how dare we say God is unrighteous who taketh vengeance? (I speak as a man who fears God.) ⁶God forbid, for then how shall God judge the world? ⁷For if the truth of God hath more abounded through my lie (as it is called of the Jews) unto his glory, why yet am I also judged as a sinner 8 and not received because we are slanderously reported? And some affirm that we say (whose damnation is just), "Let us do evil that good may come."

8 And not *rather*, (as we be slanderously reported, and as some affirm that we say,) Let us do evil, that good may come? whose damnation is just.

And it is no more that I seek to do wrong but to subdue sin that dwelleth in me. ²¹I find then that under the law, that when I would do good, evil was present with me. ²²For I delight in the law of God after the inward man. ²³And now I see another law, even the
